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






### Work package 1: Research questions

- System Mapping (Phase 1):
  - What are the main components of the UK's urban planning and development system, how does it function, and how might health impacts be better integrated within it?
- Intervention design, testing & refining (Phases 2 & 3):
  - What impact does new evidence on health outcomes have on the attitudes and behaviours of those with most control over the urban development process?

- c. Causation/centrality


### 2. Understanding of the system
